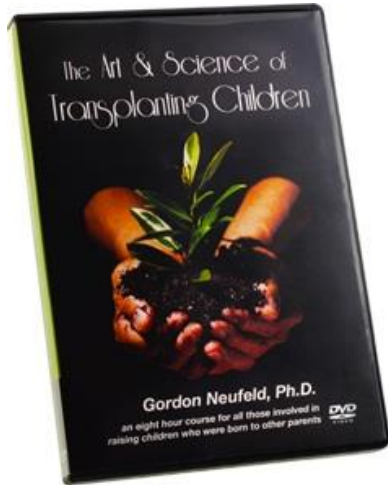

Especially for Foster and Adoptive Parents:

The impact of attachment disruption, even when in the best interests of the child, can be deep and profound, interfering with even the most loving and skilled attempts to raise the child by foster parents, adoptive parents or step parents. When such children fail to adequately re-attach to the parent or parents who are raising them, or who are unable to recover from the impact of the attachment disruption, nothing works as it should.

Our practices with such children need to be founded on a solid knowledge base of their attachment needs and of the effects that attachment disruption can have on subsequent development and receptivity to care. Transplanting children - whether the result of remarriage, adoption, parental loss, removal, or change in custody - constitutes the most difficult challenge in raising children.

Like plants, it is all about their attachment roots; unlike plants, it is a great deal more complicated.

Hold On To Your Kids: the DVD

This two-hour presentation by Dr. Neufeld captures the heart and soul of his book and the warmth that is hard to convey in writing. Those who have read the book comment on how much more accessible this presentation makes the written material. Those who prefer viewing to reading don't have to miss out on what this book has to offer.

Adolescence and Sexuality: A fresh look at today's youth using the latest understandings of human sexuality - a 4 session videocourse

Today's adolescents live in a hypersexualized culture. Most have received a school-based sex education where safe sex typically refers to physical intimacy that is free of sexually transmitted diseases or unwanted pregnancy. Despite their greater exposure and education, current evidence suggests that many youth are in trouble sexually and that their sexual development is not unfolding as it should.

How is sexuality meant to develop? What is happening today that is different than in previous generations? How does sex affect the brain and bonding? In this course, Dr. Neufeld examines sexuality through the lenses of attachment, maturation and vulnerability. He sheds light on why adolescents are losing their timidity, why sexual interaction is on the rise, and why sexual bullying is becoming a problem. He explores the meaning of safe sex from an attachment-based developmental perspective and provides suggestions for contributing to the healthy unfolding of sexuality in our youth.



Making Sense of Anxiety in Children and Youth: A four hour course with surprising solutions to a growing problem - four, one hour sessions There is currently an epidemic of anxiety affecting children of all ages. Differing estimates suggest that one in five to one in eight qualify for an anxiety disorder diagnosis, making this the most common diagnosis in children. Anxiety can take many forms including obsessions, compulsions, phobias, panic, as well as a host of perplexing seeking and avoidant behaviours. Various strategies are emerging on how to treat anxiety problems, but most interventions are hand-me-downs from adult treatment and are questionable in terms of their appropriateness with children.

Making Sense of Preschoolers: A six hour course explaining what every child needs us to know about them - six hour course divided into 12 half hour sessions No one is more susceptible to being misunderstood than the preschooler. Precocious, brazen, obsessive, endearing, hysterical, impulsive, anxious, delightful, unreflective, dogmatic, generous, unstable, aggressive, resistant, compulsive, and anything but consistent - the preschooler could qualify for any number of personality and behaviour disorders. Unlike infants and toddlers, preschoolers actually bear a resemblance to grown-ups and therefore fool us into thinking that they are much more like us than they really are. Projecting our psychology onto them is a typical mistake.

The title of this course may be misleading as it would suggest a 2-5 year age range only. In fact, understanding the preschooler is key to making sense of immaturity at any age.

Making Sense of Play: WHY children need to play and WHAT they need for true play to result - 2 hour presentation

Play - at least the kind that builds brains and forwards development - is becoming an endangered activity among those who need to engage in it most. Part of the problem is the premature pressure on children to learn and to become socialized. Another factor is the amount of screen time that children engage in. The most significant factor however is the failure to provide the conditions that result in the kind of play that helps children realize their true potential.

Play is not optional from a developmental point of view. Participants not only learn what kind of play is most beneficial but also how to support this activity in children. The information in this two-hour seminar applies to children of all ages although the primary focus is young childhood.



Making Sense of Discipline: the INs and OUTs of imposing order on children's behaviour - a 3 hour videocourse plus 1 hour bonus material This three hour course speaks to the question of what to do when ..., but does so in the larger context of what is required to raise children to their full potential as human beings. Some of the prevailing discipline practices - like time-outs and consequences - are discussed from this perspective. In three short hours, participants have the opportunity to develop a comprehensive approach to discipline with strategies that are attachment-safe and developmentally friendly. The ultimate objective of this course is for parents and teachers to come to the place where the answers will come from their own understanding and where they possess the inner confidence to handle the small stuff as well as the more challenging issues. Includes Session 7 of Power to Parent III - that deals with the special challenges of imposing order on stuck kids.

Making Sense of Attention Problems - a 4 hour videocourse

There are many kinds of attention problems, most deeply rooted in emotional and developmental dynamics. In this four hour course, participants will gain an understanding of how the attention system develops and what can go wrong and why. Participants will also learn to differentiate between three basic kinds of attention problems that can all lead to an ADD diagnosis. The ultimate objective of the course is to provide the participants with strategies for addressing the roots of the attention problems in such a way that the symptoms abate, regardless of their underlying cause.

Bullies: Their Making and Unmaking - a 4 hour videocourse

In this videocourse, Dr. Neufeld sheds light on this dark side of human nature. This refreshing developmental analysis of bullies reveals instinctive roots embedded in the dynamics of attachment and the flight from vulnerability. The implications for intervention and treatment are profound and largely counter to prevailing approaches. Invited to keynote on Canada's first national conference on bullying, Dr. Neufeld shares the insights that have evolved as a result of years of experience working with bullies of all kinds, combined with his mastery of the developmental literature.



The Power to Parent Series The ***Power to Parent*** series is a relationship-based approach to parenting that restores parents to their natural intuition and helps children realize their innate potentials as human beings. Dr. Neufeld takes the best that developmental science has to offer and delivers it directly to the people who are the child's best bet. Dr. Neufeld offers a coherent approach that can guide parents in all their parental interactions with children of all ages. The series is meant to be taken in sequence.

The Vital Connection (Power to Parent Part I) - an eight-session videocourse

In this first volume, Dr. Neufeld focuses on the child-adult relationship as the context for raising children. Parents and professional learn how this relationship is meant to develop, what can go wrong, why peers must not matter more than parents, the true meaning of shyness, how to cultivate a context of connection, how to win back one's child if need be, how to preserve the connection, and more. Parents and professionals also learn about the kinds of interactions and discipline that erode the relationship and effective alternatives that are attachment-safe.

Helping Children Grow Up (Power to Parent Part II) - an eight-session videocourse

How do we nurture our children and provide the necessary elements for growth? How do we remove the impediments to becoming their own persons? Building on the foundation of relationship in Part I of the series, this sequel focuses on how to help children realize their potential as human beings. Growing older is no guarantee of growing up. Childhood is when most of the growing up should occur but we need to know how to cultivate the maturing process. This course sheds light on the adult's role in the miracle of maturation.

Common Challenges (Power to Parent Part III) - an eight-session videocourse

Raising children is rewarding, but not always easy! Every child gets stuck from time to time on the road to maturation and every parent faces challenges at some point on the journey. At these times, we could benefit from experienced insight and practical suggestions that are in the best interest of our children. In this third part of the ***Power to Parent*** series, Dr. Neufeld helps equip parents to read the signs of a child in trouble, live with a sensitive child, cultivate resilience in a child, lead an alpha child, soften a defended child, discipline a stuck child, and more. Dr. Neufeld offers effective and safe practices that honor and preserve the relationship, even when the problems seem daunting. In making sense of a child's experience, parents are better prepared to lead them through challenging times.

Making Sense of Adolescence - an eight-session videocourse

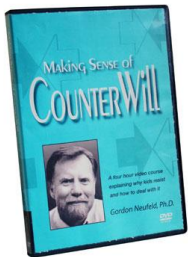

Making Sense of Counterwill - a four session videocourse

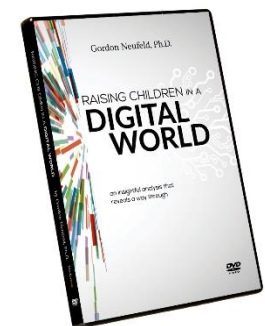

Dr. Neufeld reveals the dynamics controlling this instinct and provides suggestions for how to deal with this troubling phenomenon. This material is applicable for all adults dealing with toddlers through adolescents - teachers, parents and helping professionals. Making Sense of Aggression - a four session videocourse

Aggression problems are deeply rooted in instinct and emotion and therefore resistant to conventional discipline practices. Dr. Neufeld uncovers these roots and outlines steps to addressing them. Empowering, Connecting & Correcting Principles

In this nearly two-hour presentation, Dr. Purvis, a developmental psychologist, explains her research-based approach with children who come from what she calls “hard places.” These are children who have been exposed to drugs and alcohol in utero or suffered abuse, trauma or neglect early in life. She explains how harm during these critical stages of brain growth causes significant disruptions in a child’s development and behaviors and offers strategies to overcome these deficits. Through research and years of experience with children throughout the world, Dr. Purvis offers a path of healing through a trust-based, relationship-based holistic approach. She explains the principles and tactics for reconnecting with these children to meet their needs and help them reach their highest potential.

The Attachment Dance

The attachment relationship between parents and their children is one of the most cherished experiences of our lives. In *The Attachment Dance*, developmental psychologist and Director of the TCU Institute of Child Development, Dr. Karyn Purvis, explores the attachment experiences of neuro-typical children and children with histories of harm. Dr. Purvis explains how to recognize features of the attachment relationship and teaches parents and caregivers how to explore their own attachment styles to facilitate healing for the children in their care. In this lecture, Dr. Purvis aims to deepen understanding of attachment issues, both theoretically and practically, and provide a solid foundation for parents and their children.

This lecture provides practical insights and tips on how to use TBRI® tactics in real-life situations.

Making Sense of Complex Children

Volume 1: Introductory Overview

Federici gives insight on how to create an intervention program with simplicity and accuracy. In this DVD, Dr. Federici explains how a child's development can be altered through traumatic experiences leading to an alteration in the brain that can manifest into psychological, regulatory, social, and learning problems. Volume 3: Childhood Mental Health Disorders

In this interview, Dr. Federici sheds light on the countless number of children who are being treated with multiple layers of inappropriate care due to multiple and inaccurate diagnoses. Trauma presents itself differently, requiring a closer look at the child's anxiety and fear. This DVD will give you a better understanding of how a child's world needs to be reconstructed with the family being the primary construct, whereby the family becomes the "medication."

Volume 4: Mood Disorders and Trauma

Dr. Federici clearly explains how trauma induced mood disorders drive much of a child's negative and acting-out behaviors. He gives insight as to how anxiety, depression, mood swings, compulsive behaviors, sleep difficulties, poor social skills, reactivity, and defiance all connect back to a child's inability to regulate themselves. Solutions that center on a parent's ability and the family's ability to provide an end to the child's fear cycle are discussed in this interview.

Volume 5: Complex Trauma and PTSD

Children who are continually under stress during their early years often accumulate layers and layers of emotional injury. Their post trauma behaviors are fear-based, chaotic, and out of reality. In this interview, Dr. Federici explains how and why parents and professionals need to work at the level of the child's development in order to create safety. Healing then happens through a step-by-step developmental process with families being the curative agent.

Volume 6: Education and Trauma

Trauma can have an impact on the brain, compromising a child's focus, memory, and ability to retain, retrieve, and organize information. It can negatively impact a child's memory, speech, language, problem solving skills, and informational processing. In this series, Dr. Federici discusses how to best educate children who may present with typical behavioral or learning issues but need to be addressed from a trauma perspective in order to reach their full learning potential.

Volume 7: Teenagers

Trauma does not just "go away" and when many children reach their teenage years, a resurgence of their early traumatic experiences unfolds. Dr. Federici gives insight in this DVD discussion of how many teenagers reprocess the anger and aggression that was left dormant, resulting in an intensity of acting out behaviors (drug use, defiance, dramatic reactivity and sexual promiscuity). This DVD will give you a deeper understanding of how to help teens during these difficult years.

Volume 8: Medication Madness

There is no magic pill to resolve trauma for anyone, especially for our children. Dr. Federici explains why simply medicating symptoms is ineffective and how we have not only medicated our children to toxic levels but how we have endangered them with toxic combinations of medications. Learn more about how medications can be used at conservative levels in order to help bring children back to being functional in a family to foster greater levels of healing.

Volume 9: The Family

Children belong in families because families are the curative factor. Dr. Federici explains that for children from traumatic backgrounds, families become the definitive and key element; the family is the treatment for the child. He discusses how a family intervention program, with a holistic and reality-based approach, can be used to reconstruct traumatized children and reintegrate them back into the family system successfully.

Volume 10: Moving Forward

When children reach the later teenage years, many times they are not emotionally or developmentally ready for the challenges of independence. In this DVD, Dr. Federici discusses legal and financial options families have in order to stage their children through a slower and more gradual approach into adulthood. This volume sheds light on how to create the balance children with trauma histories need, without overwhelming them, to move them forward successfully.
